Policy statement by Chiropractic Australia on Anti-harassment at Conferences

Chiropractic Australia is committed to the principles of anti-discrimination and anti-harassment. In our conferences we generate an environment of inclusiveness and acceptance of all participants regardless of gender, sexual orientation, age, ethnicity, culture, faith, disability, physical appearance, or technological skill. Harassment or unfair discrimination is not tolerated at our conferences. Inappropriate images, language or behaviour used by conference presenters, exhibitors or attendees will result in them being sanctioned or excluded from the conference.

Chiropractic Australia - Conference Code of Conduct
